Create a fact page using an app on the ipad. Include a title, at least 5 facts and labelled images.</p>	<p>Choose your favourite book, record yourself reading with your iPad for 5 minutes. Play it back. Did you use expression? Did you stop at full stops and commas? Does it make sense?</p>
Writing	<p>Pobble365 http://www.pobble365.com/ Choose an image and complete the related activities.</p>	<p>Narrative Write a narrative. Remember it needs 5 parts: opening, build-up, problem, resolution and ending. Draw a picture to go with it.</p>	<p>Diary Entry Pretend you are a character from a book you have read and write a diary entry from their view point.</p>	<p>Handwriting Copy a page from your reading book using correct pencil grip, letter formation, spacing and punctuation.</p>

Repeat with other numbers. Year 3 = up to 10,000 Year 4 = beyond 10,000</p>	<p>Measuring Measure and record the mass (weight) of 10 items from your pantry. Order the items from lightest to heaviest. What is the difference between your heaviest item and your lightest item?</p>	<p>Shape What 3d shapes can you find around your house? Take photos and create a pic collage. Make sure you label the images.</p>	<p>Recipe Find a recipe and work out how much it would cost to buy all the ingredients. Use online catalogues. Present on an app on the iPad. <i>Ext: Double the recipe</i></p>
Extra	<p>Animal Research Research an exotic animal from another country, and create a model/drawing or digital representation of its enclosure for a zoo. Make sure you consider what it needs to survive, including its habitat, food and care.</p>	<p>ANZAC Art Draw/paint/make/create something that represents ANZAC.</p>	<p>Treasure Hunt Create a treasure hunt with a map and clues. Test it out on your family. Take some photos and take a pic collage.</p>	<p>Board Game Create your own game. How many people are needed to play? What materials do you need? How do you play. Create an instructional poster or video that explains how to play.</p>
