FRUIT AND VEGETABLE SCRAPS PRODUCED IN A DAY FALLS FROM 21% TO 9%!

On Thursday the 28 April, Miss Rigg's Year 3's from Room 12 completed a waste audit with Kalgoorlie-Boulder Urban Landcare Group (KBULG) and the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder (CKB). The waste audit identified what waste we produce as a school is being sent to landfill. Room 12's efforts found that as a school we have reduced the amount of fruit and vegetable scraps we produce! In May 2021, Ms Daily's Year 3/4 class completed a waste audit and discovered that as a school, each day, approximately 21% of our waste was fruit and vegetable scraps. In our journey to becoming a sustainable school the CKB donated us two compost tumblers and a compost bin for each class. The goal was to redirect any fruit and vegetable scraps from ending up in landfill and turning them into compost to use in the school's gardens. The whole school composting program is showing success as Room 12 found our fruit and vegetable scraps produced in a day had been fallen to 9%. Well done to the Hannans Primary School community, we continue to strive towards becoming a waste wise school.



ATTENDANCE

We continue to have quite a few staff and students away with Covid- 19. In fact, last week we averaged around 20 to 25% of our students absent. Unfortunately, not all of these absences are due to students being ill. The Education Department recognises that it is ok to miss school if a child is sick, needs to attend cultural or religious observances or has medical appointments, but it is NOT ok to miss school if your child is:

- Celebrating a birthday
- Going on a holiday or heading to Perth to buy presents
- Needs to sleep in or has had a big weekend
- Needs a haircut
- Is looking after other children

Why is going to school so important?

At school, many concepts such as literacy and numeracy are taught in a sequence. Missing school means missing out on learning – which can often make it difficult to catch up later. This is particularly important in the early years when essential foundation skills are taught.

Going to school every day helps children learn the important life skill of 'showing up' – at school, at work, to sport and other commitments.

Research from the Western Australian Telethon Kids Institute shows that every day at school counts towards a student's learning. Students who attend regularly, generally do better at school and in life.

REMEMBER MY STORY ABOUT THE CROWS?

Thank you Year 1 and 2 students! You have been SO much better at cleaning up your lunch area since I told you about our very clever crows. We have even had people bring stray lunchboxes and water bottles to the office after lunch to make sure they can't get any scraps. We need to look after our environment and make sure that we keep it safe for our native birds as well. Keep up the good work!


You can find an Application for Enrolment form on the website, Compass or you can call into the office during school hours. We look forward to welcoming our newest students to Hannans Primary School!


SUBWAY LUNCH - WED 8 JUNE | WEEK 6

Full Circle THERAPIES

The program consists of

- A screening assessment of the child's phonological awareness skills
- A brief report outlining the child's skills based on their screening results
- 6 x 1-hour sessions with your child run by a Speech Pathologist
- At the end of each session, children will be provided with activities that can be completed at home with the support of their parents, guardians and/or caregivers.
- Post-program, families will receive information summarising their child's participation and key skills they would benefit from further practise in.

The target age bracket for this group are children aged 4-6 years old however families of older children are welcome to contact the clinic should they have concerns regarding their child/children's current literacy skills.
