NAPLAN (Year 3 and 5)

NAPLAN – National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy will this year occur in Term 1 rather than Term 2 as it has been previously. The NAPLAN test window starts on **Wednesday 15th March** and finishes on **Monday 27th March**. Students in Year 3 and Year 5 will be assessed on their Literacy and Numeracy skills that they learn through their regular school curriculum. Students will sit assessment in writing, reading, conventions of language and numeracy. The tests will be administered online except for Year 3 writing which will be on paper.

For families with students in Year 3 and Year 5, information for parents will be sent home in the next couple of weeks. This will explain more about the testing, participation, reporting and how you can support your child. It is important that during the test window, students understand that NAPLAN is a part of the school program and remind them to simply just do their best. Teachers will ensure students are familiar with the types of questions in the tests and provide appropriate support and guidance. Students will also sit a practice test prior to NAPLAN.

If you require further information, please do not hesitate in contacting the school.

Techno Chat

Our Year 3 and Year 5 students had a little practice this week at NAPLAN. The test they sat was called the Omnibus test which is a mixture of math's, spelling, reading and grammar. Students participated under normal test conditions, and it gave them the opportunity to use the platform to answer questions. It was also great for the students to understand how to answer the questions as sometimes they have to type and answer, drag and drop, match or choose the answer. This gives the students practice of using the platform, not necessarily testing their knowledge. Thankfully all iPads were working with a few little glitches which were easily overcome.

For those students that have a BYOD in Year 3 and Year 5, it is really important they bring their device to school each day. A number of students in Year 5 have stopped bringing them this year and we encourage students to bring them each day. A few students also do not have their own set of headphones. Please ensure your child has headphones before NAPLAN starts in Week 7.

A note also came home this week regarding Rumbles Quest. Students will use this app once, where they will participate in a game while answering questions about their own health and wellbeing. Once the game has been completed, the app will be removed from the iPad. Please understand that Rumbles Quest is not a game that is to be played over and over. It is designed to be played once for the school to gather important data on our students. This data will assist the school to implement programs to support students on an ongoing basis. Health and Wellbeing of students is a priority for HPS and also the Department.
