## NAPLAN (Year 3 and 5)

NAPLAN – National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy will this year occur in Term 1 rather than Term 2 as it has been previously. The NAPLAN test window starts on **Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> March** and finishes on **Monday 27<sup>th</sup> March**. Students in Year 3 and Year 5 will be assessed on their Literacy and Numeracy skills that they learn through their regular school curriculum. Students will sit assessment in writing, reading, conventions of language and numeracy. The tests will be administered online except for Year 3 writing which will be on paper.

For families with students in Year 3 and Year 5, information for parents will be sent home in the next couple of weeks. This will explain more about the testing, participation, reporting and how you can support your child. It is important that during the test window, students understand that NAPLAN is a part of the school program and remind them to simply just do their best. Teachers will ensure students are familiar with the types of questions in the tests and provide appropriate support and guidance. Students will also sit a practice test prior to NAPLAN.

## Techno Chat

Week 3 has been a busy but productive week when thinking about the BYOD. Thankfully most of the BYOD are now on the school system and have been returned to students. Thank you for your patience with the BYOD as I understand it was quite a lengthy process and students did not have their iPad as directly as we, and you, would have liked. To keep you informed, we had a glitch in the system that required lots of technical help from a 'guru' in Perth. Fortunately, he was able to rectify this late yesterday allowing us to process and load the iPads today.

When your child brings their iPad home, you will be able to sign back into your Apple ID and the iPad will download any apps that were attached to the Apple ID. When students bring their BYOD to school, it will click into school Wi-Fi and log into the school system. Simple! Well, let's hope so!
