2024 KINDY ENROLMENTS

Kindy enrolments for 2024 are now open!

If you have a child born between 01.07.2019 and 30.06.2020 they are eligible to attend Kindergarten in 2024. Please call into the office at Hannans PS and collect an Application for Enrolment.

Western Australia now has immunisation laws that will help to better protect our children and the wider community from vaccine-preventable diseases.

When you enrol your child in Kindergarten you will need to provide your child's current Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) Immunisation History Statement, which shows your child is 'up-to-date' with all the scheduled immunisations (according to the National Immunisation Program) for their age. This Statement must be no more than 2 months old.

Enrolment remains open until Friday 21 July 2023. After this time letters of offer will be sent out and once accepted you will be required to complete further paperwork. Play to Learn continues to operate on a Monday morning for students who will be attending Kindy in 2024.

TECH TALK

Hello Hannans PS Community,

Today has been a busy day with our STRIVE launch – but loads of fun! One of our STRIVE values is 'innovation' both with and without technology which fits with what I am going to build on from last week. Previous newsletter, I spoke about building an agreement as a family around technology and how it is used in the home. Last time we talked about setting a time for when technology is put away – not just for the kids but for the whole family.

Did your family get started on your technology agreement?
Is it on the fridge to remind you all daily?
Or maybe it is somewhere else visible for the whole family?

If you didn't get it started – don't worry, there is still time.

This week it would be great to build on this and talk with your children about where devices are used. Maybe only in shared spaces like the lounge room, kitchen or family room. That way parents can easily see and hear what their child is accessing or playing.

A rule to add to your agreement might read:

'I will only use my device in the lounge room, family room or kitchen.'
'I will ask before I use my device or play a new game online.'

You can adapt this to make it suit your family!
